

THE FUTURE OF SA PROPERTIES


Australian properties are as popular as ever, but with a growing population and greater demand for homeownership, Aussie blocks are getting smaller. We spoke to the experts to hear what they've got to say.

Property expert and **Professionals Ultimate** Director, Peter Taliangis, says the days of huge blocks and big backyards are gone.

"The average family home is currently being built on 450-500 m²," he says.

"There's generally enough room for 20 m² of grass, or maybe a fraction more if a two-story home is built. That means pools and tennis courts are slowly making way for an al fresco area and a strip of garden bed." Todd Schulberg from Homely.com.au says this trend towards smaller blocks means people have to rethink how to make their backyards work better for them:

"People are living on smaller blocks and starting to adapt their idea of a dream home to be something a little more versatile and unique ... In the future, an Aussie backyard is more likely to be a balcony with a railing or a very small outdoor area."

IMPROVING PROPERTY VALUE

"Adding value to your home should be about adding value where you can use it most, not where you can see it most. People are more attracted to liveability rather than image. On top of that, people don't want to pay top dollar for someone else's personal touch and style; they want to buy something neutral that they can make their own and then add their own value. Keep things simple, clean and remember to not over-clutter."



BACKYARD FOR THE SA LANDSCAPE



Fellow Adelaidian and creator of **Sarah's House**, Sarah Shanahan, thrives on creating beautiful, balanced and peaceful spaces in the family home. We sought her advice on landscaping the perfect South Australian backyard. Here's what she told us:

Our climate and laid-back lifestyle draws us outdoors. It's so much more relaxing hanging out in your own personal outdoor space – and, of course, it's much healthier for the kids!

Being a Professional Organiser, I like things to be organised – and that goes for my garden and outdoor space as well.

I love the simplicity of my backyard. With four kids and a dog we don't want anything too fancy and high maintenance; it's all about relaxing and enjoying our backyard with room for the kids to kick the footy and generally muck about!

We have ornamental pears surrounding the yard, followed by agapanthus, and a big lawn area framed by an English box hedge. There's a paved area for entertaining that we love. We also painted our fences charcoal and I love the warmth it gives against all the greenery.

We also have a huge gum tree that gives the backyard beautiful shade on those hot summer mornings and I'm very grateful for that. Everything feels cosy and enclosed.

As for future trends, I've noticed pods in the backyard are becoming more common. Anything from reused shipping container structures to garden sheds are reused and fitted out as home offices or kids' retreats. I desperately need one!

I've been lucky to travel a lot and one thing we have in Australia is space. Live in London, Paris or Rome and you essentially sleep on top of your neighbour. They see our backyards and can't believe it!

AUSTRALIA DAY, THE SA WAY



South Australia's events calendar is choccas with fun outdoorsy stuff organised throughout the year. From Adelaide Cup Day to Easter, there are plenty of reasons to get out and about. But for South Australians, Australia Day takes the cake as the state's biggest holiday.

Sarah Shanahan likes to celebrate the day in true SA style, sparking up the grill and making it a social event.

She says: "Australia Day is huge – it's right at the height of summer so it always involves an outdoor barbeque with friends in our backyards."

If you're near the coast, it's a close bet you'll head down to the beach to soak in the sun and host a BBQ on South Australia's beautiful shores.

But the big events happen in the city. Australia Day in the City is Adelaide's number one public party. Over 40,000 locals head there annually to join the parade, concert and fireworks!

Head into the city to watch the parade pass at 6pm. Then make your way to Elder Park where a twilight Australia Day concert kicks off an hour later.

It wouldn't be Australia Day without the fireworks, of course. Find a spot along the Torrens or in Elder Park to watch the spectacle. It's the perfect way to round off the day.

If you're feeling flat when Australia Day ends and the kids head back to school, you don't need to worry; the Fringe Festival is just around the corner.

"Here in Adelaide, the Fringe festival during "Mad March" celebrates all things cultural," Sarah says.

"It's our last chance to make the most of the summer weather, so everyone is out and about enjoying the Great Outdoors!"

Cosi has a rather different event he looks forward to every year:

"For me it's got to be the Marrabel Bull Ride! I never miss it. I've been going to rodeos since I was a kid with my dad and even had a few goes at bull riding in my early 20s, though I was never much good!".
